INCLUDE:

All doors, windows, bedrooms, walls, stairways and hallways.

Designate at least two exits for each room - doors and windows. Make sure you have an escape ladder in each bedroom that is located on the second floor.

Specify a meeting place outside the home where family members can gather once everyone has gotten out.



Home Safety Checklist

Do this page with a grown up. Tour your home and use this checklist to make sure your home is safe!

<u>IN THE LIVING AREAS</u>

- The fireplace has a sturdy screen.
- Portable heaters or any other heaters are at least 3 feet away from anything that can burn.
- All candles are in sturdy bases placed up high and are never left unattended while burning.
- Matches and lighters are kept up high in a locked cabinet, out of sight of children.

IN THE KITCHEN

- Cooking is never left unattended.
- There is always a pan lid within reach when cooking. Should a fire break out, turn off the burner and put the lid on the pan.
- Always wear tight fitting sleeves when cooking; loose clothing can easily catch fire.
- A fire extinguisher is available if necessary.

IN THE HALLWAY/BEDROOM(S))

- All smoke alarms are checked monthly to make sure they are working.
- All smoke alarm batteries are changed at least once a year.
- Replace smoke alarms after 10 years.

<u>ESCAPING A FIRE</u>

- Have a home escape plan, and practice it twice a year with your family. (Turn the page for a graph to draw it out)
- All family members know two ways to get out of every room.
- If you have security bars on your window, do you have quick release devices?
