SUPPORT SERVICES REPORT – (Deputy Chief Wagaman)

Facilities:

- 1) Station 50 dormitory project, framing and drywall are complete and have passed inspections. Crews are now working on wall texture and paint.
- 2) Station 102 HVAC unit swap out is complete.
- 3) Station modifications have begun at station 102 in preparation for the implementation of Squad 102.

Communications:

- 4) Preparing to upgrade station altering in the new dorm at station 50
- 5) 4 support vehicles, including 1 new MIH vehicle undergoing up-fitting to support operational response
- 6) 3 new ambulance and 4 new type 5 engines will be equipped with radios and computers in the coming weeks

CRRD:

7) DFM Nygren & Marshal Law attended the Board of Supervisors meeting on March 26th for the first hearing of the revised Fireworks Ordinance. The ordinance was approved by the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors on April 09.

Notable changes for the community to be aware of are:

- a. The window for fireworks sales in Sacramento is shortened to noon on March 28th through 9 pm on July 4th.
- b. Permissible hours for fireworks use are 09:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m. during the aforementioned date range only.
- c. Enhanced fines for fireworks use on the American River Parkway <u>and</u> all schools, and parks. There is a \$10,000 fine for each offense.

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- 8) In 2023 the FIU recommended 2 juvenile subjects attend the Youth Fire Setter Program after fireworks related incidents.
 - d. Fire Investigators worked extensively with both families to encourage participation in the Youth FireSetter Program. The subjects successfully completed the program academy on March 20, 2024.
 - i. Of note, I would like to recognize Fire Inspector II Roman Klets who attended the academy with one of the subjects all three nights to serve as a Russian language translator.
- 9) On March 16, 2024, a fire occurred at 3333 Arden Way and involved an unhoused male that was living in the mansard of a vacant building. Investigator Morton apprehended and cited the suspect on arson charges.
- 10)On April 5, 2024, Investigators Sargent and Morton worked together to investigate a report of a male lighting multiple garbage cans on fire on Pope Ave. One unhoused suspect was arrested and booked on charges of arson as well as outstanding warrants.

Mr. Owen reported that most of the union leadership is at IAFF 10th District Conference. Had a productive meeting to discuss the transitioning of FDMs to MMP's and we look forward to continuing those discussions.
