Sacramento 9/11 Memorial Stair Climb event, they were in a new location this year, and happy to be back post-pandemic. Thank you to everyone involved in planning the event, and to those who participated in the climb.

Deputy Chiefs and Assistant Chiefs Greene and Rudnicki attended the CalChiefs Conference in Sacramento. It was great to have the event locally, and we were able to reconnect and build back some relationships throughout the state.

OPERATIONS' REPORT

Deputy Chief Mitchell shared there have been 4,106 total incidents since our last report on September 8, 2022; an average of 293 calls per day. There were 148 fire incidents, an average of 10.5 calls per day. Crews had two fire incidents as the storm front moved through last week with the wind.

As for OES Deployments, all engines and members deployed have returned safely back home. The rain was a welcome weather change for fire behavior.

Metro Fire responding crew received some positive feedback from an EMS call involving a 78 year old female complaining of weakness post fall. She fell face first on the court playing pickle ball, striking her forehead on the ground. Even though the patient was GCS 15, Paramedic Plotka determined the patient could have sustained significant spinal injury. She was placed in full spinal mobile restriction (SMR) and transported code 3 to MSJ. Paramedic Plotka also identified that her weakness was a new onset, and could have caused her to fall, so he advised MSJ of both a trauma and stroke alert. Per MSJ, the patient had multiple spinal fractures and significant artery damage in her spine that mimicked a stroke. MSJ praised our crew's treatment and assessment, mentioning that any additional head movement without SMR could have left her paralyzed. Excellent work to Captain Jon Davis, Engineer Steve Tafoya, Firefighter/Paramedic Ryan Bridges, Paramedic Artur Plotka, and Paramedic Noah Novotny.

3. SMFD – FIREFIGHTERS LOCAL 522 REPORT

Vice President Matt Cole shared that the E-Board met last week, and they are preparing for the 50th Anniversary for the Firefighters Burn Institute this weekend. He invited everyone to come and participate in the remembrance event that created the institute on Saturday, October 24th.

He wishes those members who moved onto other agencies all the best. He also welcomes Jake as the GIS Specialist. This is a position that has been vacant for some time, Local 522 worked closely with Administration to make the position what it is now. VP Cole is looking forward to strengthening the organization and retaining the employees we bring to Metro Fire.

TOPIC

Reauthorize the Fire Chief to enter into an intergovernmental agreement to transfer public funds to the State of California Department of Healthcare Services (DHCS), which is necessary to participate in the Voluntary Rate Range Program (VRRP) Intergovernmental Transfer (IGT), a federal reimbursement program, covering the period from January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

DISCUSSION

Beginning in Fiscal Year 2014/15, the District has participated in the VRRP IGT to receive federal funds associated with the District's transport of Medi-Cal managed care beneficiaries. Participation in the VRRP requires the District annually to enter into an agreement with the DHCS and each of the participating managed care plans (Plans), currently Aetna, Anthem, Health Net, Kaiser, and Molina.

In September 2022 all VRRP participants were advised by DHCS that the agreement covering the 2021 calendar year would have to be revised and reapproved due to federal Centers for Medicaid Service requirement changes pertaining to the classification of immigrant beneficiaries. The changes to the District's agreement relate to transfer of funds and written communications.

The proposed agreement covers the 12-month period January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

The DHCS agreement is also substantially similar to those entered into in previous fiscal years.

FISCAL IMPACT

No impact. This agreement does not change the current year budgeted IGT revenue of \$8.7 million.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board approve the attached resolution reauthorizing the Fire Chief to enter into the necessary agreement with DHCS to participate in the VRRP IGT covering the period January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021.

INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT REGARDING TRANSFER OF PUBLIC FUNDS

This Agreement is entered into between the CALIFORNIA DEPARTMENT OF
HEALTH CARE SERVICES ("DHCS") and the SACRAMENTO METROPOLITAN FIRE
DISTRICT ("GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY") with respect to the matters set forth
below.

The parties agree as follows:

AGREEMENT

1. Transfer of Public Funds

- of funds to DHCS pursuant to sections 14164 and 14301.4 of the Welfare and Institutions Code. The amount transferred shall be based on the sum of the applicable rate category per member per month ("PMPM") contribution increments multiplied by member months, as reflected in Exhibit 1. The GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY agrees to initially transfer amounts that are calculated using the Estimated Member Months in Exhibit 1, which will be reconciled to actual enrollment for the service period of January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 in accordance with Sub-Section 1.3 of this Agreement. The funds transferred shall be used as described in Sub-Section 2.2 of this Agreement. The funds shall be transferred in accordance with the terms and conditions, including schedule and amount, established by DHCS.
- 1.2 The GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY shall certify that the funds transferred qualify for Federal Financial Participation pursuant to 42 C.F.R. part 433, subpart B, and are not derived from impermissible sources such as recycled Medicaid payments, Federal

money excluded from use as State match, impermissible taxes, and non-bona fide provider-related donations. Impermissible sources do not include patient care or other revenue received from programs such as Medicare or Medicaid to the extent that the program revenue is not obligated to the State as the source of funding.

actual enrollment in HEALTH PLAN(S) for the service period of January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021 using actual enrollment figures taken from DHCS records. Enrollment reconciliation will occur on an ongoing basis as updated enrollment figures become available. Actual enrollment figures will be considered final two years after December 31, 2021. If reconciliation results in an increase to the total amount necessary to fund the nonfederal share of the payments described in Sub-Section 2.2, the GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY agrees to transfer any additional funds necessary to cover the difference. If reconciliation results in a decrease to the total amount necessary to fund the nonfederal share of the payments described in Sub-Section 2.2, DHCS agrees to return the unexpended funds to the GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY. If DHCS and the GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY mutually agree, amounts due to or owed by the GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY may be offset against future transfers.

Acceptance and Use of Transferred Funds

- 2.1 DHCS shall exercise its authority under section 14164 of the Welfare and Institutions Code to accept funds transferred by the GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY pursuant to this Agreement as IGTs, to use for the purpose set forth in Sub-Section 2.2.
- 2.2 The funds transferred by the GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY pursuant to Section 1 and Exhibit 1 of this Agreement shall be used to fund the non-federal share

of Medi-Cal Managed Care actuarially sound capitation rates described in section 14301.4(b)(4) of the Welfare and Institutions Code as reflected in the contribution PMPM and rate categories reflected in Exhibit 1. The funds transferred shall be paid, together with the related Federal Financial Participation, by DHCS to HEALTH PLAN(S) as part of HEALTH PLAN(S)' capitation rates for the service period of January 1, 2021 through December 31, 2021, in accordance with section 14301.4 of the Welfare and Institutions Code.

- 2.3 DHCS shall seek Federal Financial Participation for the capitation rates specified in Sub-Section 2.2 to the full extent permitted by federal law.
- 2.4 The parties acknowledge that DHCS will obtain any necessary approvals from the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.
- 2.5 DHCS shall not direct HEALTH PLAN(S)' expenditure of the payments received pursuant to Sub-Section 2.2.

3. <u>Assessment Fee</u>

- 3.1 DHCS shall exercise its authority under section 14301.4 of the Welfare and Institutions Code to assess a 20 percent fee related to the amounts transferred pursuant to Section 1 of this Agreement, except as provided in Sub-Section 3.2. GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY agrees to pay the full amount of that assessment in addition to the funds transferred pursuant to Section 1 of this Agreement.
- 3.2 The 20-percent assessment fee shall not be applied to any portion of funds transferred pursuant to Section 1 that are exempt in accordance with sections 14301.4(d) or 14301.5(b)(4) of the Welfare and Institutions Code. DHCS shall have sole discretion to determine the amount of the funds transferred pursuant to Section 1 that will not be subject to a

20 percent fee. DHCS has determined that \$0.00 of the transfer amounts will not be assessed a 20 percent fee, subject to Sub-Section 3.3.

3.3 The 20-percent assessment fee pursuant to this Agreement is non-refundable and shall be wired to DHCS simultaneously with the transfer amounts made under Section 1 of this Agreement. If at the time of the reconciliation performed pursuant to Sub-Section 1.3 of this Agreement, there is a change in the amount transferred that is subject to the 20-percent assessment in accordance with Sub-Section 3.1, then a proportional adjustment to the assessment fee will be made.

4. Amendments

- 4.1 No amendment or modification to this Agreement shall be binding on either party unless made in writing and executed by both parties.
- 4.2 The parties shall negotiate in good faith to amend this Agreement as necessary and appropriate to implement the requirements set forth in Section 2 of this Agreement.
- 5. <u>Notices</u>. Any and all notices required, permitted, or desired to be given hereunder by one party to the other shall either be sent via secure email or submitted in writing to the other party personally or by United States First Class, Certified or Registered mail with postage prepaid, addressed to the other party at the address as set forth below:
- * Any required signature(s) on any documents must be in compliance with California

 Government Code section 16.5 and any other applicable state or federal regulations.

6. Other Provisions

This Agreement contains the entire Agreement between the parties with respect to the Medi-Cal payments described in Sub-Section 2.2 of this Agreement that are funded by the GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY, and supersedes any previous or contemporaneous oral or written proposals, statements, discussions, negotiations or other agreements between the GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING ENTITY and DHCS relating to the subject matter of this Agreement. This Agreement is not, however, intended to be the sole agreement between the parties on matters relating to the funding and administration of the Medi-Cal program. This Agreement shall not modify the terms of any other agreement, existing or entered into in the future, between the parties.

- 6.2 The non-enforcement or other waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall not be construed as a continuing waiver or as a waiver of any other provision of this Agreement.
- 6.3 Sections 2 and 3 of this Agreement shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.
- 6.4 Nothing in this Agreement is intended to confer any rights or remedies on any third party, including, without limitation, any provider(s) or groups of providers, or any right to medical services for any individual(s) or groups of individuals. Accordingly, there shall be no third party beneficiary of this Agreement.
 - 6.5 Time is of the essence in this Agreement.
- 6.6 Each party hereby represents that the person(s) executing this Agreement on its behalf is duly authorized to do so.
- 7. <u>State Authority</u>. Except as expressly provided herein, nothing in this Agreement shall be construed to limit, restrict, or modify the DHCS' powers, authorities, and duties under Federal and State law and regulations.
 - 8. Approval. This Agreement is of no force and effect until signed by the parties.
- 9. <u>Term.</u> This Agreement shall be effective as of January 1, 2021 and shall expire as of June 30, 2024 unless terminated earlier by mutual agreement of the parties.

Parking Lot Lease

THIS LEASE AGREEMENT ("Lease") is dated this _____ day of October, 2022, by and between Gabor and Octavia Kovac ("Lessor"), and Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, an autonomous Special District established under California Health and Safety Code Section 13800 ("Lessee").

In consideration of the mutual covenants in this Lease, Lessor and Lessee agree as follows.

1. The Premises. Lessor leases to Lessee, and Lessee takes from Lessor, the following property located in Citrus Heights, California:

A 17,651 square foot vacant lot located at 7629 Greenback Lane (APN# 243-0150-012-0000) as shown on the attached Exhibit A ("Premises").

- 2. Term. The term of this Lease ("Term") shall commence upon November 1st, 2022 and run for an initial term through May 31st, 2023, unless terminated earlier in accordance with this Lease.
- 3. Use. Lessee shall use the Premises as a parking lot. Lessee shall not use or allow others to use the Premises for any other purpose without the prior written consent of Lessor, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld.
- 4. Rent. Effective upon the commencement of the Lease, Lessee shall pay Lessor rent in the amount of fifteen hundred dollars per month (\$1,500/month), payable on the fifteenth (15th) day of the following month in which the parking spaces were used.
- 5. Security Deposit. Lessee shall pay Lessor a refundable deposit of \$1,500.00 for use of the Premises. The deposit shall be returned to Lessee upon the termination of the Lease.
- 6. Maintenance and Repair. Lessor is solely responsible for all maintenance and repair of the Premises and shall keep the Premises in a neat and safe condition. Lessor and Lessee shall not store or release any hazardous or toxic substances of any kind at the Premises. Lessor shall maintain the Premises in compliance with all laws, ordinances, or regulations governing the Premises.
- 7. Assumption of Risk. Parking is solely at the risk of the vehicle owner. Lessor is not assuming any risk. Any security, if necessary, is to be provided by Lessee.
- 8. Condition. Lessee has had the opportunity to inspect the Premises prior to signing this Lease and accepts the Premises in AS IS condition without any representation from Lessor as to its condition or suitability for Lessee's intended use. If a condition subsequently arises, including a hidden defect, which substantially interferes with Lessee's use of the Premises, Lessee may terminate the Lease by providing 30-days written notice to Lessor.
- 9. Alterations. Lessee shall not make any alterations, additions, or improvements to the Premises without first obtaining the written consent of Lessor, which consent will not be unreasonably withheld.
- 10. Liability; Indemnification. Each party agrees that they shall indemnify, defend and hold the other party and its governing body, officers, agents and employees, harmless from any and all claims, damages, losses, causes of action and demands, including reasonable attorneys' fees and

costs, incurred in connection with or in any manner arising out of the indemnifying party's performance of this Agreement. The indemnifying party, at the indemnifying party's own expense and risk shall defend any and all actions, suits, or other legal proceedings that may be brought or instituted against the other party, the members of its governing body, officers, agents, and employees for any such claims, damages, losses, demands, liabilities, costs or expenses incurred in connection with or in any manner arising out of the indemnifying party's performance of this Agreement. The indemnifying party shall not be liable for damage or injury occasioned by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of the non-indemnifying party and its officers, agents, or employees. It is the intention of the parties that where comparative fault is determined to have been contributory, principles of comparative fault will be followed and each party shall bear the proportionate cost of any damage attributable to the fault of that party, its elected and appointed officials, officers, directors, employees, representatives, agents, subcontractors, and volunteers. These indemnification provisions shall survive the termination of the Lease.

11. Insurance. Lessee shall maintain at all times commercial general liability insurance insuring Lessor and Lessee against all claims or demands for personal injuries to or death of any person, and damage to or destruction or loss of property, that may be claimed to have occurred on the Premises as a result of Lessee's use thereof. The policies shall cover such risks and be in such amounts as Lessor from time to time may reasonably request, but in any event with a combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage per occurrence of not less than Two Million Dollars (\$2,000,000.00).

Lessee's insurance shall be issued by an insurer licensed to do business in the State of California and shall contain a waiver of subrogation endorsement. Lessee shall deliver to Lessor certificates of such insurance coverage and evidence of payment of all premiums promptly upon demand by Lessor, which certificates shall show Lessor as an additional insured and shall provide that no cancellation, reduction in amount, or material change in coverage shall be effective until at least thirty (30) days after receipt of written notice to Lessor.

- 12. Assignment; Sublease. Lessee may assign this Lease and Lessee may sublease the Premises in whole or in part with Lessor's written approval which shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 13. Lessor's Right of Access. Lessor and Lessor's employees or agents, shall have the right to enter the Premises in a reasonable manner upon reasonable advance notice to Lessee to inspect the Premises or to conduct surveys, testing, or studies in connection with any engineering, design, financing, or permitting activities related to potential development of the Premises; provided, however, that no notice will be required in emergency circumstances where it is impractical to provide Lessee with advance notice. Lessor shall use reasonable efforts to minimize any disruption of Lessee's activities.
 - 14. Default. Each of the following shall constitute an Event of Default:
 - Lessee fails to maintain at all times the insurance required by this Lease. a.
 - Lessee fails to comply with any agreement or requirement in this Lease for a period b. of thirty (30) days after notice from Lessor.

If an Event of Default has occurred and continues, Lessor may terminate Lessee's rights to the use the Premises and pursue any other remedies available under California law.

15. Termination. Either party may terminate the Lease for cause by providing the other party not less than ninety (90) days' notice. On the expiration of the Term, or any earlier termination of this Lease, Lessee shall: (a) immediately vacate the Premises; (b) repair all damage to the Premises


caused by Lessee's removal of its equipment and property from the Premises; and (c) restore the Premises to the same condition that existed at the commencement of the Term, reasonable wear and tear excepted.

- 16. Entire Agreement, Applicable Law. This Lease contains the entire agreement of the parties with respect to the leasing of the Premises and any supplements or amendments to the agreement must be in writing and signed by both parties to be enforceable. This Lease shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of California.
- 17. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary, Lessor shall have the right to terminate this agreement, for no cause whatsoever, by giving 30 days' notice in writing.

BACKGROUND

On September 24, 2020, the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District (District) Board of Directors accepted a FY2019 AFG Fire Prevention and Safety Grant Program (FP&S) award to conduct a comprehensive Community Risk Assessment and develop a Community Risk Reduction Plan.

The District was able to complete the approved scope of work under budget, which left \$49,889 in unspent funds. In accordance with the terms and conditions of the grant award, unspent funds remaining after the completion of the approved scope of work may be used for other activities that support grant program priorities, at the sole discretion of and approval by the awarding agency.

DISCUSSION

One of the identified mitigation measures recommended in the District's Community Risk Reduction Plan is expanding fire safety education partnerships with schools and daycare centers. In support of this recommendation, the District requested an amendment to the FP&S19 scope of work to utilize unspent funds on the development of digital fire and life safety educational content and reinforcement tools targeting K-6 grade children. The content will be distributed to all K-6 schools in the District's jurisdiction (130 public and private schools serving approximately 20,000 children).

The District's amendment request was approved by FEMA on September 20, 2022 and an extension to the grant's period of performance was granted through November 15, 2022.

FISCAL IMPACT

While the approved amendment did not result in any fiscal impact to the District, the amendment was not approved until after the adoption of the Final Budget, so unspent funds in the amount of \$49,889 have been consolidated into one expense account and will be updated in the Final Budget by way of budget amendment.

A RESOLUTION ADOPTING A BUDGET AMENDMENT TO THE FINAL BUDGET FOR THE GRANTS FUND 212G FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2022/23

WHEREAS, the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District was awarded a FY2019 Fire Prevention and Safety Grant (FPS&19) in the amount of \$261,518 but completed the project under budget leaving \$49,889 of unspent funds; and

WHEREAS, staff submitted an amendment request to utilize the unspent funds on additional scope that supports the project's goals and objectives; and

WHEREAS, the amendment request was approved by FEMA on September 20, 2022; and

WHEREAS, on September 8, 2022, the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District adopted the Final Budget for the Grants Fund 212G for Fiscal Year 2022/23, which did not include all of this funding.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, in accordance with Section 13890 of the Health and Safety Code, the Final Budget for the Grants Fund 212G for the Fiscal Year 2022/23 will be and is hereby further amended in accordance with the following: DUDCET

BACKGROUND

On September 9, 2021, the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District (District) Board of Directors accepted a FY2020 State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP20) award in the amount of \$33,723 for the installation of controlled access systems at five fire stations, which was completed earlier this year.

DISCUSSION

In August 2022, the District submitted an amendment request to increase the scope of work on its SHSGP20 station access control project utilizing disencumbered funds made available by the Sacramento County Office of Emergency Services (SacOES), who administers SHSGP funding for the Sacramento County operational area.

On September 13, 2022, the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors approved an amendment to the District's SHSGP20 award for additional funding in the amount of \$48,094 to expand the scope of the station access control project. The District will utilize the funding to complete the installation of controlled access systems at six additional stations.

FISCAL IMPACT

The total cost for the additional scope of work is \$51,977, which includes \$48,094 in SHSGP20 funding and \$3,883 to be funded by the District through a transfer from the General Fund into the Grants Fund.

Staff recommends adoption of the attached SHSGP20 Grant Amendment Resolution and corresponding Budget Amendment Resolutions.

Budget Amendment - Phase 2 Station Access Control Project Change Order

BACKGROUND

On May 26, 2022, the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District (District) Board of Directors accepted a FY2021 State Homeland Security Grant Program (SHSGP21) that included an allocation of \$106,666 to fund the Phase 2 Station Access Control project. On August 11, 2022, the Board approved a bid award totaling \$112,077.70 to Access Systems, Inc. for the installation of controlled access systems at eleven fire stations in support of the project.

DISCUSSION

Subsequent to the approval of the bid award, the District determined that the project would require a performance and payment bond to be provided by Access Systems, Inc., which was not included in the original scope of work and was therefore excluded in the bid price. The additional cost has resulted in a change order on the bid price reflecting a new total project cost of \$115,104 and will require amendments to the General Fund and Grants Fund budgets.

FISCAL IMPACT

The total cost for the change order is \$3,026.30, which will be funded by the District through a transfer from the General Fund into the Grants Fund.

ImageTrend Contract Renewal (3 years) & Test Site Implementation

TOPIC

Staff is seeking approval to renew our existing contract with ImageTrend for an additional three years and add on a test site to limit the impact of interface updates for end users.

BACKGROUND

Metro Fire has maintained a contract with ImageTrend since September 2014, which began with the implementation of our Electronic Patient Care (ePCR) System. In 2020, we upgraded our fire reporting (NFIRS), arson investigations, and data analytics systems to be technologically in line with the ePCR system.

DISCUSSION

Since the implementation of the ePCR system, we've experienced numerous advances in technology and the EMS system itself. ImageTrend is already integrated with CAD, local hospitals, neighboring agencies, and the recently upgraded LP15 monitors. EMS System Technicians have received specialized training in the ImageTrend program, and work with a specially-assigned ImageTrend account advisor regularly to maintain system optimization.

ImageTrend allows for the production of fire reports, provides data collection and the built-in tools needed for budgeting, grants, training, and more. The Investigations module permits fire investigators to document all aspects of their investigation, including things such as witnesses, evidence grids, and weather-related information. The Continuum module provides active data monitoring to enhance patient care and the statistics used in operational and administrative decision making. The addition of a test site will make it possible for system updates to be performed in a test environment to provide a preview of the end user's experience. Having this opportunity will permit any necessary changes to be made in advance to alleviate potential system interruptions and subsequent need for restoration. Continuing and enhancing our contract with ImageTrend will benefit the District as a whole.

FISCAL IMPACT

The cost of the renewal of our current ImageTrend contract services is \$175,884.72, which is included in the final FY 22/23 budget. Each year after March 2023, we will incur a 3% increase in the contracted rates. The implementation of the ImageTrend test site totals \$7,000 for the first year (\$10,500 each year thereafter), which will be covered by a transfer from A.EMS.203500 – Education and Training Services to A.TEC.281100 – Computer Services. The funds to be transferred will not affect the services for which they were originally intended, as the contract for Handtevy training was under budget, providing a cost savings in the account.

LEGAL IMPACT

No legal impact known.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Board of Directors approve the ImageTrend contract renewal for three years.

WHEREAS, a required condition is that a state of emergency is declared by the Governor pursuant to Government Code section 8625, proclaiming the existence of conditions of disaster or of extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the state caused by conditions as described in Government Code section 8558; and

WHEREAS, a proclamation is made when there is an actual incident, threat of disaster, or extreme peril to the safety of persons and property within the jurisdictions that are within the District's boundaries, caused by natural, technological, or human-caused disasters; and

WHEREAS, it is further required that state or local officials have imposed or recommended measures to promote social distancing, or, the legislative body meeting in person would present imminent risks to the health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, meeting in person would present imminent risk to health and safety of attendees; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors does hereby find that conditions causing imminent risk to attendees has caused, and will continue to cause, conditions of peril to the safety of persons within the District that are likely to be beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of the District, and desires to proclaim a local emergency and ratify the proclamation of state of emergency by the Governor of the State of California; and

WHEREAS, as a consequence of the local emergency, the Board of Directors does hereby find that the legislative bodies of the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District shall conduct their meetings without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of Government Code section 54953, as authorized by subdivision (e) of section 54953, and that such legislative bodies shall comply with the requirements to provide the public with access to the meetings as prescribed in paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of section 54953; and

WHEREAS, all meetings will be held in a virtual manner where the public may access them via the virtual platform with all login information provided on each board meeting agenda.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SACRAMENTO METROPOLITAN FIRE DISTRICT DOES HEREBY RESOLVE AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Recitals. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and are incorporated into this Resolution by this reference.

Section 2. <u>Proclamation of Local Emergency</u>. The Board hereby proclaims that a local emergency now exists throughout the District, and meeting in person would present imminent risk.

Section 3. <u>Ratification of Governor's Proclamation of a State of Emergency</u>. The Board hereby re-ratifies the Governor of the State of California's Proclamation of State of Emergency, effective as of its issuance date of March 4, 2020.

Section 4. Remote Teleconference Meetings. The staff and legislative bodies of the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to carry out the intent and purpose of this Resolution including, conducting open and public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e) and other applicable provisions of the Brown Act.

Section 5. <u>Effective Date of Resolution</u>. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption and shall be effective until the earlier of (i) November 11, 2022, or such time the Board of Directors adopts a subsequent resolution in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e)(3) to extend the time during which the legislative bodies of the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District may continue to teleconference without compliance with paragraph (3) of subdivision (b) of section 54953.
