That search ended successfully. We are very proud of Tyler for his work and dedication to the people he serves. Congressman Kiley's Visit

I'd like to publically thank our Department membership for welcoming Congressman Kevin Kiley last Friday at Fire Station 32, on Hazel Avenue in Fair Oaks. The Congressman was truly interested in our Department's operations, its multitude of emergency capabilities and our recent response to the Winter Storms that wreaked havoc in our region and the State of California. Mr. Kiley was particularly interested in viewing the flood rescue boats, the swift water rescue boats and the helicopter. Our personnel provided informative briefings and personal stories of their work that seemed to be of great interest to the Congressman and his staff. I'd like to thank Kyle Macdonald, Jeff Frye, DC Mitchell, DC Bailey, AC Jenkins, BC Russell, the crews from Station 32, Station 65 and our Air Operations Division. Also, thank you to Directors Saylors and Webber for participating in the Congressman's visit.

Workers' Compensation Update

My thanks to our HR Division and DC Bailey for continuing to listen to you and our members, and working to provide improved services for those of our membership who suffer Workers' Compensation injuries. They have recently drafted a very useful flow chart which is being used to identify where we have direct influence over the WC process, where we have indirect influence and where legal statutes determine the process. Additionally, they have established performance objectives for our Third Party Administrator RFP, as well as proposed contractual performance objectives so we can better monitor the performance of our TPA during the course of the contract. Lastly, the HR Division will be working with Captain Cahill to develop a series of short podcasts and videos, which will be available to our members, and caregivers, on how to better understand and navigate the Workers Compensation process. These are just some of the ways we are listening and acting upon recommendations to aid our members.

Smoke Alarm Blitz

Thank you to Captain Wilbourn and his team from Community Relations for coordinating a smoke alarm blitz in North Highlands and Rio Linda last Saturday. We had tremendous support from our CERT team and the Red Cross in handing out 99 smoke alarms to the neighborhoods surrounding the loss of life fires that occurred there recently. Thank you to our Board members Clark, Saylors, and Wood for walking the streets with us.

Reporting and Resolution for CY 2022

TOPIC

Compliance with California Senate Bill 1205 California Health and Safety Code Section 13146.4 regarding mandatory inspection of public and private schools and certain residential occupancies for the calendar year 2022.

DISCUSSION

California Health & Safety Code Section 13145 specifies that the State Fire Marshal, the chief of any city, county, or city and county fire department or district providing fire protection services shall enforce in their respective areas building standards relating to fire and panic safety adopted by the State Fire Marshal and published in the California Building Standards Code and other regulations that have been formally adopted by the State Fire Marshal for the prevention of fire or for the protection of life and property against fire or panic.

California Health & Safety Code Section 13146 identifies the responsibility for enforcement of building standards adopted by the State Fire Marshal and published in the California Building Standards code relating to fire and panic safety and other regulations of the State Fire Marshal.

California Health & Safety Code Section 13146.2 requires every city or county fire department or district providing fire protection services required by Sections 13145 and 13146 to enforce building standards adopted by the State Fire Marshal and other regulations of the State Fire Marshal to annually inspect all structures subject to subdivision (b) of Section 17921 for compliance with building standards and other regulations of the State Fire Marshal. Subdivision (b) of Section 17921 pertains to the rules and regulations for fire and panic safety in all hotels, motels, lodging houses, apartment houses and dwellings, buildings, and structures accessory thereto.

California Health & Safety Code Section 13146.3 requires the chief of any city or county department or district providing fire protection services and authorized representatives to inspect every building used as a public or private school within the jurisdiction for the

purpose of enforcing regulations promulgated pursuant to Section 13143, not less than once each year.

In September of 2018, Senate Bill 1205 (SB 1205) added a new section to the California Health & Safety code which affected every city or county fire department or district required to perform the above-described inspections. The bill requires every fire department or district to report annually to its administering authority their compliance with the above described annual inspection requirements.

Additionally, SB 1205 requires the administering authority to acknowledge receipt of the report in a resolution or a similar formal document. SB 1205 holds jurisdictional policy makers accountable to make progress on fire prevention resource requests, and ensures fire department funding allocations account for the longstanding needs of resource deficient fire prevention bureaus.

RECOMMENDATION

Pursuant to the requirements contained in SB 1205, staff recommends that the Board of Directors adopt a resolution acknowledging receipt of the annual report regarding the inspection of public and private schools and certain residential occupancies for the calendar year 2022.

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RESOLUTION NO. 2023-___

A RESOLUTION OF THE SACRAMENTO METROPOLITAN FIRE DISTRICT ACKNOWLEDGING RECEIPT OF A REPORT MADE BY THE FIRE MARSHAL OF THE SACRAMENTO METROPOLITAN FIRE DISTRICT REGARDING THE INSPECTION OF CERTAIN OCCUPANCIES REQURIED TO PERFORM ANNUAL INSPECTIONS IN SUCH OCCUPANCIES PURSUANT TO SECTION 13146.2 AND 13146.3 OF THE CALIFORNIA HEALTH AND SAFETY CODE.

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Section 13146.4 was added in 2018, and became effective on September 27, 2018; and,

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 requires all fire departments, including the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, that provide fire protection services to perform annual inspections in every building used as a public or private school, hotel, motel, lodging house, apartment house, and certain residential care facilities for compliance with building standards, as provided and,

WHEREAS, California Health & Safety Code Section 13146.2 requires all fire departments, including the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, that provide fire protection services to report annually to its administering authority on its compliance with Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors of the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District intends this Resolution to fulfill the requirements of the California Health & Safety Code regarding acknowledgment of the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District's compliance with California Health and Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Directors of the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District that said Board expressly acknowledges the measure of compliance of the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District with California Health and Safety Code Sections 13146.2 and 13146.3 in the area encompassed by the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, as follows:

A. EDUCATIONAL GROUP E OCCUPANCIES:

Educational Group E occupancies are generally those public and private schools, used by more than six persons at any one time for educational purposes through the 12th grade. Within the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, there lie 379 Group E occupancies, buildings, structures and/or facilities.

During Calendar year 2022, the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District completed the annual inspection of 379 Group E occupancies, buildings, structures and/or facilities. This is a compliance rate of 100% for this reporting period.

Additional items of note regarding this compliance rate can be found in the accompanying staff report for this resolution.

B. RESIDENTIAL GROUP R OCCUPANCIES:

Residential Group R occupancies, for the purposes of this resolution, are those occupancies containing sleeping units, and include hotels, motels, apartments (three units or more), etc. as well as other residential occupancies (including a number of residential care facilities). These residential care facilities have a number of different sub-classifications, and they may contain residents or clients that have a range of needs, including those related to custodial care, mobility impairments, cognitive disabilities, etc. The residents may also be non-ambulatory or bedridden. Within the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, there lie 1869 Group R (and their associated sub-categories) occupancies of this nature.

During Calendar year 2022, the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District completed the annual inspection of 1869 Group R occupancies, buildings, structures and/or facilities. This is a compliance rate of 100% for this reporting period.

Additional items of note regarding this compliance rate can be found in the accompanying staff report for this resolution.

Request Authorization Finding that an Emergency Exists and Authorizing Contracting Without A Competitive Solicitation for Bids Pursuant to Public Contract Code Section 22050 For the Repair, Demolition, and Clean-Up of Station 101

BACKGROUND

On June 12, 2014 the District elected to become subject to the California Uniform Construction Cost Accounting Act (Act). Per the Act, public projects of sixty thousand dollars (\$60,000) or less may be performed by the employees of a public agency by force account, by negotiated contract, or by purchase order. Public projects of two hundred thousand dollars (\$200,000) or less, however, may be let to contract by informal bidding procedures as set forth in the California Public Contract Code (PCC), Article 3. Public Projects: Alternative Procedures (Sections 22030-22045).

Additionally, Section 22035 of the PCC states:

- (a) In cases of emergency when repair or replacements are necessary, the governing body may proceed at once to replace or repair any public facility without adopting plans, specifications, strain sheets, or working details, or giving notice for bids to let contracts. The work may be done by day labor under the direction of the governing body, by contractor, or by a combination of the two.
- (b) In case of an emergency, if notice for bids to let contracts will not be given, the public agency shall comply with Chapter 2.5 (commencing with Section 22050 Emergency Contracting Procedures).

DISCUSSION

On January 29, 2023 an electrical fire occurred in the kitchen of Fire Station 101, causing damage to the kitchen, dormitory, day-room, and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) room. To ensure continuous service delivery to the community, the E101 crew has been relocated to the Arson building adjacent to Station 101, and Medic 101 is now stationed at Station 102, as Station 101 is not safe for occupancy in its current state.

After the fire was extinguished, the District's Facilities Division contacted ATI Restoration LLC. (ATI) to assess the damage and provide an estimate on the costs to restore the station to a condition safe for occupancy. The estimated cost provided by ATI is \$103,646.28, which exceeds the Act's threshold for contracting public projects without an informal procedure.

The PCC defines "Emergency" as "a sudden, unexpected occurrence that poses a clear and imminent danger, requiring immediate action to prevent or mitigate the loss or impairment of life, health, property, or essential public services." The conditions described above create an emergency situation that impacts the health and safety of staff, and expeditious repair of Station 101 is essential to ensure continuous service delivery to the community.

Per PCC 22050 (a) (1), in the case of an emergency, a public agency, pursuant to a four-fifths vote of its governing body, may repair or replace a public facility, take any directly related and immediate action required by that emergency, and procure the necessary equipment, services, and supplies for those purposes, without giving notice for bids to let contracts.

Before a governing body takes any action pursuant to paragraph (1), it shall make a finding, based on substantial evidence set forth in the minutes of its meeting, that the emergency will not permit a delay resulting from a competitive solicitation for bids, and that the action is necessary to respond to the emergency.

FISCAL IMPACT

No fiscal impact is known for this authorization request.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board approve a resolution finding that an emergency does exist and authorize contracting without a competitive solicitation for bids pursuant to PCC Section 22050 for the repair, demolition, and clean-up services required to restore Station 101 to a condition safe for occupancy by staff.

Additionally, if the Board does so approve the authorization described above, the Board shall review the emergency action at its next regularly scheduled meeting and at every regularly scheduled meeting thereafter until the action is terminated, to determine, by a four-fifths vote, that there is a need to continue the action. The Board shall terminate the action at the earliest possible date that conditions warrant to do so.

AUTHORIZING THE FINDING THAT AN EMERGENCY EXISITS AND AUTHORIZING CONTRACTING WITHOUT A COMPETITIVE SOLICITATION FOR BIDS PURSUANT TO PUBLIC CONTRACT CODE SECTION 22050 FOR THE REPAIR, DEMOLITION, AND CLEAN-UP OF STATION 101

WHEREAS, the District owns, operates, and maintains Fire Station 101 located at 3000 Fulton Avenue, Sacramento, CA 95821; and

WHEREAS, on January 29, 2023 a fire occurred in the kitchen of Fire Station 101, causing damage to the kitchen, dormitory, day-room, and Emergency Medical Services (EMS) room; and

WHEREAS, the E101 crew must now sleep at the Arson building adjacent to Station 101; and

WHEREAS, Medic 101 must now be stationed at Station 102; and

WHEREAS, urgent repair is required to restore Station 101 to a condition safe for occupancy; and

WHEREAS, the conditions described above create an emergency situation that impacts the health and safety of staff; and

WHEREAS, expeditious repair is essential to ensure continuous service delivery to the community; and

WHEREAS, the District has elected to become subject to the California Uniform Public Construction Cost Accounting Act (CUPCCAA); and

WHEREAS, public projects in excess of \$60,000 shall be let to contract by the CUPCCAA bidding procedures;

WHEREAS, in cases of emergency when repair or replacements are necessary, Public Contract Code (PCC) sections 22035 and 22050 provide that a governing body may proceed at once to replace or repair any public facility, take any directly related and immediate action required by that emergency, and procure the necessary equipment, services, and supplies for those purposes, pursuant to a four-fifths (4/5) vote without giving notice for bids to let contracts; and

WHEREAS, before a governing body takes any action to proceed with emergency repairs or replacements pursuant to PCC sections 22035 and 22050, it shall make a finding, based on substantial evidence set forth in the minutes of its meeting, that the emergency will not permit a delay resulting from a competitive solicitation for bids, and that the action is necessary to respond to the emergency.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, a public entity established under the laws of the state of California, Board of Directors does hereby:

Adopt this resolution by a four-fifths (4/5) vote authorizing and approving the declaration of emergency on February 9, 2023, pursuant to Public Contract Code Sections 22035 and 22050 for emergency repairs, demolition, and clean-up at Station 101, and finding that the emergency will not permit delay resulting from competitive solicitation of bids.
