REPORT OUT FROM CLOSED SESSION

PUBLIC COMMENT: Matt Carr, a self-proclaimed former Prosecutor who worked on behalf of other public safety clients, began his comment by thanking the District for their service. He also relayed that he is an avid river user and expressed concerns about the Metro Fire rescue boats. He has observed that they always appear to be operating at top speed, and while he is understanding that time is of the essence, this speed causes several problems including: possible accidents with other crafts and people on the river, erosion of the banks, and a negative perception of first responders by the members and communities they serve. Mr. Carr encouraged the Board to consider amending their policies for the use of speed with the watercraft and to only use excessive speed when absolutely necessary. Mr. Carr closed with declaring that he was grateful for the opportunity to speak but would have liked to not have to wait until after the closed session to do so.

2. FIRE CHIEF'S REPORT – (Chief Harms)

Chief Harms thanked the Staff and Board Members who attended the Station 61 dedication to Engineer Robert Werner. He also relayed that the District attended a 2x2 meeting with the Sacramento County Board of Supervisors which was very well received. He closed with stating that there was currently a 2-alarm fire which our crews were responding to.

OPERATIONS' REPORT – (AC Greene)

Assistant Chief Greene reported that the 21-1 Academy was going strong with 22 recruits. Drill Master Captain Todd reported that all recruits are in good spirits. He gave kudos to E61 and M55 on A Shift who were recognized by the UC Davis STEMI Care Coordinator on June 18 for the care of a heart attack patient. Their early notification allowed for excellent care and a full recovery of the patient.

He also reported that since the last board meeting on July 8, there were 4,313 total calls for service with 14 structure fires, 4 of which were strictly within Metro's jurisdiction. One of these is the fire that Chief Harms referenced in his report, a 2-alarm in North Highlands. Also, E53 and M101 had the most responses during that period.

There are currently two OES Engines deployed, one to the Bootleg Fire in Oregon, and one to the Tamarack fire just South of Tahoe with 4 personnel. Those deployed to the Bootleg Fire are expecting demobilization, however will likely be redirected to another fire in Washington or Northern California. Also, Captain Duane Miller was deployed to the state of Washington at the Summit Trail Fire as part of the Incident Management Team. Shift commanders are in contact with the deployed members daily to ensure that they are doing well and have no additional needs.

3. SMFD - FIREFIGHTERS LOCAL 522 REPORT

Vice President McGoldrick relayed that the members are still dealing with staffing issues, including a rise in mandatories and call-backs. Membership is doing what they can to staff all stations. Now that the Lateral Firefighter recruitment process is closed, they are looking forward to the results and also at long-term solutions to assist members moving forward.

SUMMARY

DISCUSSION

The County of Sacramento is conducting the selection process for a Special Districts Representative to serve on the Sacramento County Treasury Oversight Committee. The duties of the committee include review of the Investment Policy of the Pooled Investment Fund, quarterly review of investments, and to cause an annual audit of the portfolio. The position requires academic or practical experience in public finance, and should meet the restrictions as outlined in the Treasury Oversight Committee Fact Sheet. TOPIC

Disclosure of material expenditure for annual Oracle software subscription fees relating to the District's enterprise resource planning (ERP) system.

SUMMARY

The Oracle ERP software is used by all divisions to manage and integrate the District's financials, supply chain, operations, reporting, and human resource activities. There is an annual subscription fee associated with the software application that covers ongoing maintenance and upgrades. For fiscal year 2021-22, the annual subscription fee is \$229,685.30.

DISCUSSION

In 2018, when the District acquired the Oracle ERP system, Board approval included an annual subscription fee of \$177,158 for a period of five-years. Subsequently, due to the addition of two test environments and an increase in the number of users, the annual subscription fee was increased to \$229,685.

FISCAL IMPACT

The impact to the current fiscal year is \$229,685.30. Sufficient funds were included in the Preliminary Budget for fiscal year 2021-22 to meet this obligation.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Board of Directors authorize payment of the Oracle ERP software annual subscription fee in the amount of \$229,685.30 for fiscal year 2021-22.

Therefore, the business of the Special District Selection Committee will be conducted in writing, as provided in the cited section code.

The Sacramento Local Agency Formation Commission meets on the **first Wednesday of the month at 5:30 P.M.**, Board Chambers, County Administration Center, 700 H Street, Sacramento, California. The Commission meeting is on recess January and July. The term of this office is four years beginning January 1, 2022 thru December 31, 2025.

To be valid, a nomination must be made by a majority vote of the governing board of an Independent Special District in an official meeting of that board and certified by the Secretary or Clerk of the Board. The nominee must be an elected or appointed Independent Special District

Officer residing within the County of Sacramento but shall not be members of the legislative body of a city or county [(CKH Section 56332 (c)].

At the end of the nominating period, the Executive Officer will prepare and send, to each Independent Special District, one ballot listing candidates and voting instructions. The ballot will include the names of all nominees submitted for Office No. 7 and Alternate for Office No. 6 & 7. The districts must return the ballots to the Executive Officer by the date specified in the voting instructions, which date will be at least 30 days from the date on which the Executive Officer mailed the ballots to the districts. Any ballot received by the Executive Officer after the specified date shall not be valid. The candidate who receives the most votes will be determined the winner outright. In the event of a tie, there will be a run-off election held in the same format as the initial election. The Executive Officer will announce the results of the election within seven days of the specified date.
